<u>At 11.20am (approx) on Friday 9th December</u> we will continue with Stage 1 assembly – Years 1 and 2 and present the class awards and some special stage awards. This assembly should conclude by 1.00pm.

Presentation Day will be focussed on celebrating the achievements of all students and recognising their efforts over the whole year. There will be entertainment at all assemblies over the two days including the bands, dance groups, choirs, percussion group, violin group and choral group. Parents are warmly invited to attend. Hoping you can put these days and times aside in your diaries and come to enjoy the celebrations with your children.

#### Leadership Training

Year 5 students are currently participating in some sessions of leadership training, which they are very much enjoying. We undertake this process each year and all students feel that it is a very enjoyable and interesting process. Students are working with Mrs Keating, Mrs Cooper and Mr Harrison around the aspects of 'What Makes a Good Leader' and how they can all be leaders in life and use the skills they are developing. The sessions conclude in two weeks with all students able to nominate candidates for student executive positions for 2012. The nominations will take place at school at the end of this training.

Candidates will give their speeches to the student body on **Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> December in the new school hall**, after which voting will take place to elect the school leaders for 2012. We are really impressed with the way all Year 5 students have enthusiastically been involved in the process. Our sports leaders will participate in a similar process on **Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> December**.
