Class Contact Lists

This is a friendly reminder that the Class Contact Lists compiled by the P&C go out under the following premise:

"This year we are once again compiling class contact lists. These are useful when planning catchups, parties and school holiday activities. Only parents who choose to be included on the list will receive a copy and the details are not otherwise published or distributed."

To respect people's privacy, we ask that you do not share the information on these lists. If someone is new to your class and wishes to be added, they can contact the P&C, and we can amend the list. The P&C compiles and distributes these lists as a service to the community. If these lists put people's private information at risk, then we will no longer be able to do so.

2013 – P&C Spotlight on the Treasurer

We need an enthusiastic person with some basic financial skills to fill the position of P&C Treasurer in 2013. What does the Treasurer do? The following is from the NSW P&C "Fact Sheet" on the Treasurer: Whilst all P&C members must be mindful of complying with financial accountability requirements, this is the Treasurer's primary responsibility. The Treasurer receives and deposits monies, maintains records, draws cheques and presents accounts. The Treasurer presents a report in the form of an income and expenditure statement together with a reconciled bank statement for each and every P&C meeting. The Treasurer should encourage members to understand the state of the P&C finances. The Treasurer must ensure a case book or books are kept, recording all financial transactions of the P&C Association.

All positions on the P&C executive will become vacant at the March Annual General Meeting. The position of Secretary, Correspondence Secretary and one Vice-President can be filled by the people currently in the roles. However, the P&C positions of **President, Vice-President and Treasurer** must be filled by new people in 2013. We are looking for interested and energetic people for these roles.
