PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

It's really hard to believe that we are in Week 10 and there is only just over a week of school left. The last day for students is Wednesday of next week. The school will be officially closed after Wednesday.

This week is an extremely important week with our Presentation Days being the culmination and celebration of learning for all students.

Below is the outline of the program over those two days.

Presentation Day - this Thursday 13th December

We will begin our 2012 Presentation Day program with a whole school assembly from Kinder to Year 6 at 9.00am under the COLA, to present the major awards and prizes as well as invest and present the school captains, prefects, sports house captains and vice captains with their badges. This assembly should take no more than 30 minutes. After this at the following assemblies, in the new school hall every single child in every class will be called forward to receive a certificate.

At 9.40am on Thursday 13th December in the new school hall, we will continue with the stage 3 assembly (Years 5 and 6) – and present the class awards and some special stage awards.

At 11.00am on Thursday 13th December there will be a morning tea supplied for parents staying on for the next assembly.

At 11.30am on Thursday 13th December we will continue with stage 2 assembly (Years 3 and 4) and present the class awards and some special stage awards. This assembly should conclude by 1.00pm.

Presentation Day – this Friday 14th December

At 9.15am on Friday 14th December in the new school hall we will hold the Early Stage 1 assembly – (Kindergarten) and present the class awards and some special stage awards.

At 10.45am (approx) on Friday 14th December will be a morning tea supplied for parents staying on for the next assembly.

At 11.00am (approx) on Friday 14th December we will continue with stage 1 assembly (Years 1 and 2) and present the class awards and some special stage awards. This assembly should conclude by 1.00pm. Presentation Day will be focussed on celebrating the achievements of all students and recognising their

efforts over the whole year. There will be entertainment from some class groups during the Presentation Days. <u>All</u> <u>parents are warmly invited to attend</u>.

We should have a copy posted on the P&C webpage this week. Meanwhile, you may be interested to know that 126 Parent/Student surveys (30%) were returned out of the 415 that were sent home. Here is the summary of those responses:

Do you think The Junction Public School needs a motto?

YES: 92% (116) NO: 8% (10)

If you think we need a motto, do you think we should develop a new motto, or keep the current motto?

Keep the current motto-61%, Develop new motto-34%, Don't know-2%, Answered "no" to previous question, so didn't answer-2%

Do you think The Junction Public School needs a pledge?

YES: 74% (93) NO: 21% (26) Don't know: 6% (7)

If you think we need a pledge, do you think we should develop a new pledge, or keep the current pledge?

Keep the current pledge-48%, Develop a new pledge-36%, Answered "no" to previous question, so didn't answer-14%, Don't know-2%

At the December P&C meeting we concluded that there is no further action required about the school motto, but the pledge will be discussed further in 2013.

WORLD VISION SPONSORSHIP


The students' of The Junction School have sponsored two children through the World Vision Organisation.
