Year 4 Camp



Year 5 High School Experience

Over the last few weeks students from Year 5 have participated in activities at Newcastle High School. These activities are designed to give all students an opportunity to experience a high school environment and to meet other students, at the same stage of schooling from around the district. The Sports Gala was a great day and students participated in Soccer, Netball, Austag and Ultimate Frisbee. Last week the students experienced woodwork, food technology and science lessons that were designed and taught by the high school teachers. This program is an important part of the transition to high school process and regardless of what high school the students attend in the future, it allows them to begin to understand the next step in their school life. Congratulations

Congratulations to all our senior mathematicians. Last Friday at the Stage 2 & 3 assembly the awards for the Newcastle Permanent Mathematics Competition were presented. The level of achievement this year was very high. In Year 5, there were 28 merits, 14 distinctions and 2 high distinctions. In Year 6 there were 18 merits, 20 distinctions and 4 high distinctions. All these students are to be commended. Special mention needs to be made of Chris Beck from 6C. Chris was recognised at the official awards ceremony last Wednesday at Hunter Stadium as one of The Hunters most outstanding junior mathematicians. Cooper Janzen from 5S has also been recognised for his achievement and has been invited to attend the Primary Mathematics Camp next March.



Debating Medal

Another achievement recognised at last week's assembly was for debating. Ruby Z of 5C was presented with the 'Tracy Williams medal'. This award is presented annually by the District debating adjudicators to a Newcastle district Year 5 student who shows an excellent understanding of the debating process and who is capable of presenting articulate, well thought-out ideas. Well done Ruby!

Leaving school safely

I would like to remind parents that travelling to and from school should be planned and students should be reminded to consider safety and security during these times. School finishes at 3pm. All students should be collected at this time or attend OOSH. There is no supervision in the play areas after this time and students cannot stay behind and play. If a teacher asks a student to stop playing and wait with their parent they are just following the 'duty of care' rules. If a parent is unexpectedly held up, the teacher will take the child to the office so the family can be phoned. As students get older they often walk or ride home. Please remind your child to leave school promptly and to walk or ride with friends. It is not a good idea for any child to be the last one on the street.

A Note from the Office

- The office asks you have the correct money for excursions etc because we <u>do not have any</u> <u>change</u>....money is banked every day!
- Payment at the office before 3pm would be appreciated as we need to close off for the day.
- School absences If your child is absent from school, once your child returns to school you must supply written advice of their leave. You only need to phone the school if the absence is over 3 days. No need to phone the office if the absence is for 1 day only.
- Holiday Leave (5 school days or under) Please ensure you advise the teacher in writing (prior to the leave if possible).
- Holiday Leave (over 5 school days) You must come to the office and pick up an "Exemption for Leave" form prior to your holiday leave.
- Medication at School The school is unable to administer Panadol. If your child requires medication it must be prescribed by a doctor and in the original packaging with the child's name and dosage. A Medical Indemnity Form is required to be filled in at the office.

YEAR 5 VISIT TO NEWCASTLE HIGH SCHOOL

Last Tuesday, Year 5 students participated in the Newcastle High School 'taster lessons'. We were put into groups that all got the chance to take part in two of the three following lessons: cooking, woodwork and science. It was extremely fun to try all the different high school subjects. In cooking, we made 'M & M cupcakes' using different tools and ingredients. In woodwork, we made a tool that takes your shoes off for you. To do this, we used two blocks of wood, sandpaper, a hammer, nails, a nail punch and wood putty. In science, we had a close look at things under the microscope. We looked at words, sugar, sand, iron, glitter, etc. We also took part in a fun experiment, using vinegar and baking soda. When we mixed both ingredients together, a chemical reaction took place, 'fizzing' the mixture up. We also looked inside the cupboards, where we got to see the Bunsen burners, some test tubes, and much, much more! We had so much fun at Newcastle High School, and we thank the school for giving us this wonderful opportunity to have a feel of what high school is like!


