PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

It's really hard to believe that we are in Week 10 and there is only just over a week of school left. The last day for students is Wednesday of next week. The school will be officially closed after Wednesday.

This week is an extremely important week with our Presentation Days being the culmination and celebration of learning for all students. Below is the outline of the program over those two days.

Presentation Day – this Thursday 11th December

We will begin our 2014 Presentation Day program with a whole school assembly from Kinder to Year 6 at 9.00am under the COLA, to present the major awards and prizes as well as invest and present the school captains, prefects, sports house captains and vice captains with their badges. This assembly should take no more than 30 minutes. After this at the following assemblies, in the new school hall every single child in every class will be called forward to receive a certificate.

At 9.40am on Thursday 11th December in the new school hall, we will continue with the Stage 3 assembly (Years 5 and 6) – and present the class awards and some special stage awards.
