## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

### Building Program - Administration

We have commenced another phase of our building program with the refurbishment of the administration block. This has necessitated all the admin staff and executive staff moving out of the admin block and relocating to the old hall. Parents will now need to go to the old hall for all dealings with our admin staff.

There will also be some changes to school operation and how we access the grounds of the school from Union Street. From today access will be from the small pedestrian gate and through the back OOSH or After School Care gates. The middle gate on Union Street will be blocked off because of the works commencing.

Access for the students from the canteen to the COLA area will be changed as the walkways will be closed off. These works are expected to be finished by the end of this term.

### Classroom Buildings

Currently the footings are now being poured for our 5 new classrooms. We are expecting that the framework will be visible within the next couple of weeks as the building program is progressing on target and as expected. We look forward with interest as our new classrooms 'emerge'!

### Presentation Days 2015

Following is information to parents that our Presentation Days will take place on Thursday 10th and Friday 11th December this year. We will start on Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> December with a whole school assembly from **Kinder to Year 6 at 9.00am** over at the new hall (due to the building works), present the major awards and prizes as well as invest and present the school captains, prefects, sports house captains and vice captains with their badges. This assembly should take approximately 40 minutes. At the following assemblies, again in the new school hall every single child in every class will be called forward to receive a certificate.

**At 9.50am on Thursday 10th December** in the new school hall we will continue with the Stage 3 assembly (Years 5 and 6) – and present the class awards and some special stage awards.

**At 11.00am on Thursday 10th December** there will be a morning tea supplied for parents staying on for the next assembly.

**At 11.30am on Thursday 10th December** we will continue with the Stage 2 assembly (Years 3 and 4) and present the class awards and some special stage awards. This assembly should conclude by 1.00pm.

**At 9.15am on Friday 11th December** in the new school hall we will hold the Early Stage 1 assembly – (Kindergarten) and present the class awards and some special stage awards.

**At 10.00am (approx) on Friday 11th December** we will continue with the Stage 1 assembly (Years 1 and 2) and present the class awards and some special stage awards. This assembly should conclude by 11.15am (approx.)

A morning tea will be available to all attending parents during this time.

**Presentation Day will be focussed on celebrating the achievements of all students and recognising their efforts over the whole year. There will be some small class items at each assembly.**

### Outstanding Payments

These outstanding fees exclude any that may be voluntary, and includes only materials and activities that require the user to pay. **At present, the school has covered these costs from our global budget which is affecting our ability to organise other activities.** We urgently need to be reimbursed for these amounts.

Our budget is designed to be shared equally throughout the entire school population. If this has been an oversight on your part, could you please attend to payment of these invoices as soon as possible? Many thanks.

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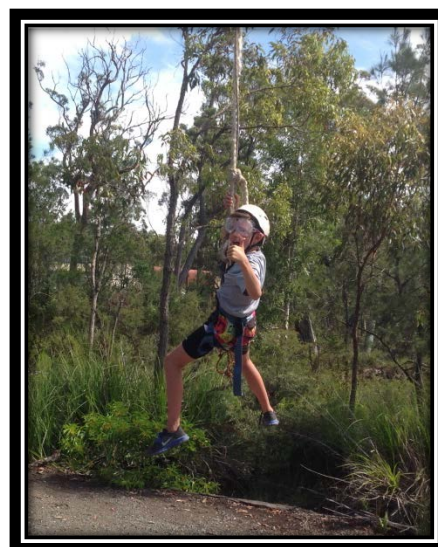
