#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

#### 2015

It's really hard to believe that we are in Week 10 and there is only just over a week of school left. The last day for students is Wednesday of next week. The school will be officially closed after Wednesday.

This week is an extremely important week with our Presentation Days being the culmination and celebration of learning for all students. Below is the outline of the program over those two days.

#### **Presentation Days**

We will start on **Thursday 10th December with a whole school assembly from Kinder to Year 6 at 9.00am** now – under the COLA area – from what we were previously advertising. Here we will present the major awards and prizes as well as invest and present the school captains, prefects, sports house captains and vice captains with their badges. This assembly should take approximately 50 minutes.

At the following assemblies, in the new school hall, every single child in every class will be called forward to receive a certificate.

At 10.00am on Thursday 10th December in the new school hall we will continue with the Stage 3 assembly (Years 5 and 6) – and present the class awards and some special stage awards.

At 11.00am on Thursday 10th December there will be a morning tea supplied in the COLA of the new hall, for parents staying on for the next assembly.

At 11.30am on Thursday 10th December we will continue with the Stage 2 assembly (Years 3 and 4) and present the class awards and some special stage awards. This assembly should conclude by 1.00pm.

At 9.15am on Friday 11th December in the new school hall we will hold the Early Stage 1 assembly – (Kindergarten) and present the class awards and some special stage awards.

At 10.00am (approx) on Friday 11th December we will continue with the Stage 1 assembly (Years 1 and 2) and present the class awards and some special stage awards. This assembly should conclude by 11.20am (approx.) A morning tea will be available to all attending parents during this time.

Presentation Day will be focussed on celebrating the achievements of all students and recognising their efforts over the whole year. There will be some small class items at each assembly.

The adult was able to assist the child on this occasion.

Would you please speak with your children about what you would like them to do if approached by a stranger at any time? We tell them not to engage at all – to politely walk away; to seek help at a shop or from another adult etc. I know this is all a bit worrying – but unfortunately it is a reality.

On Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> December the PSSA boys travelled to Maitland to play the Semi Final against Orange Public school for a chance in the State Final.
