Skoolbag is Here!!

We are going to begin using Skoolbag! What is Skoolbag?

Skoolbag is a mobile App for our school to communicate directly to parents. It works through both smart phones and smart devices (such as iPads and Android tablets). It provides schools with an easy way to tell parents/carers everything they need to know and it provides parents with the most convenient way to receive school notifications.

We will be able to send school free push notifications, information about school events, school newsletters, school documents – permission notes, alerts, events, links to websites, school social media – Facebook, Twitter etc.

Today with this newsletter you will receive a flyer with information on how to install Skoolbag on your iPhone or Android device. In this fast paced world in which we live - we know this is going to be of great use to our parents and community and further improve communication.

Anaphylaxis Information

Information on Anaphylaxis

This year at The Junction Public School we have a significant number of students throughout the school who have a range of allergies including nut allergies, seafood allergies, egg allergies, fish allergies and grass allergies. Some of these students may have a slight reaction such as skin irritation etc while others may have a more serious allergic reaction which affects their breathing and respiratory system and requires the use of an Epi-pen. This is a device which is used to inject adrenalin into the mid-thigh of a student. For some students, without this intervention a severe allergic reaction could be life threatening.

I have been in contact with Hunter Health and their advice is to keep the community informed as I am doing now, to work towards making our school an “allergy friendly” school. This will involve having class teachers talk to all students about the allergies in our school, how we need to be mindful of the foods we have present near these students and how we will work together to make the school environment safe for everyone. Students in some classes may be asked to wash their hands regularly if they have a child who has allergic reactions.

Class teachers may send notes home to inform all parents in a particular class of the specific information relating to allergies in that class. **While we cannot ensure that we have, a ‘nut-free’ environment we can certainly attempt to make all environments at school ‘allergy friendly’ by being thoughtful about what food or allergens are brought to school or are near these children at school. It would be very helpful if nuts were not sent to school at all for example.** If you require further clarification – please feel free to contact me. Thank you for your support.

TECHNOLOGY INFORMATION

Digital citizenship & safety online – Posting images of children online

There are Commonwealth privacy laws relevant to the unauthorised production and publication of a person's image through the Privacy Act 1988 (Cth). These laws regulate the publication of personal information that conveys the identity of a person or allows their identity to be determined. The Privacy Act 1988 (Cth) states that **images of children that would enable them to be identified (for example, in a school uniform, outside their house, with their name) should not be published on the Internet without the consent of their parent.**

It is good practice to also seek the child or young person's consent to ensure their privacy is not breached. The United Nations (1989) Convention on the Rights of the Child recognises the right of children to freedom from interference to their privacy and the right to express their views in matters that affect them.

There are also laws that protect the identity (e.g., names and images) of children and young people involved in child protection, family court, or criminal proceedings as victims or offenders.

Become an Ethics Teacher at The Junction Public School

Primary Ethics provides the opportunity for NSW public primary school students who don't attend scripture classes (SRE) to participate in philosophical Ethics Classes. The classes teach children how to approach ethical issues and develop their capacity for considered moral judgement, which will enable them to respond more thoughtfully to many of the problems and issues they will face in their lives.

This year we have our biggest enrolment in Ethics at The Junction since the program started in 2011. However, to provide weekly Ethics Classes to all of the children who would like to attend we need more Volunteer Ethics Teachers. We would be especially keen to recruit Ethics Teachers from our new kindergarten parents as currently only one third of the kindergarten children who have registered for ethics are able to participate as class sizes are limited.

Volunteer Ethics Teachers are trained to deliver our age-appropriate curriculum every week and to use the accompanying learning and teaching materials. More information on what is required to become an Ethics Teachers can be found at www.primaryethics.com.au
