### VALUES MESSAGE

#### Values – Integrity

For the next few weeks we will be discussing the value of integrity.

Having integrity is more than just knowing what is right. Knowing what is right does not mean much if you don't **do** what is right.

Nobody is perfect. Sometimes we make choices that might hurt other people.

If you have wronged somebody you should own it and apologise for what you have done.

Next you should do right by it – show the person that you can learn from your mistakes and you're still a good person.

Finally, let it go. Whether the person forgives you or not, let it go, forgive yourself and try to do better.

If you have had a disagreement with a friend or someone in your family do what you know is right – own it, apologise, do right by it and let it go.

#### Safety Reminder

A number of students have been riding bikes, skateboards and scooters inside the school grounds when they arrive at school and when they are leaving. This is not safe as the areas are very busy in the mornings and afternoons. Please remember if students ride to school on a bike, scooter or skateboard they are to push their bike or scooter or carry their skateboard in and out of the school gates. Please remind your child/children of this safety message so they can consider the safety of others.

**ATTENDANCE – LATE ARRIVALS**

For safety reasons, it is important that parents are aware that their child has been late to school. The office staff started to issue white paper slips to students who presented late at school without a parent/carer. This is firstly to inform you that your child was late and secondly to ask you to explain this period of absence. Students are told to give the slips to their parents. We ask that you read, verify/explain the reason for absence, sign and return the slip to the front office within 7 days. Parents may also wish to phone the school or present in person. Thank you to those parents who have followed this process and returned slips to school with an explanation of the partial absence. We encourage students to be at school and on time every day.

## EXTENDED LEAVE

If your child is going to be absent for over (5) school days you must fill in an Extended Leave Form before you go on holidays. The Principal will approve and sign the form and a 'Certificate of Leave' will be returned to the parent. These forms are available from the school office. Thank you.

## SMS system for Attendance

Parents must provide an explanation for all absences, **including partial absences**, to the school within 7 days from the first day of any period of absence. Where an explanation has not been received within the 7 day timeframe, the school will record the absence as unjustified on the student's record.

To assist with this process, we have introduced an SMS system to notify parents of full day absences. **If you receive a notification please phone, email, use the Skoolbag App or write a note to explain your child's absence.** Please refrain from using Class Dojo messages on the morning of absences as it is not always possible for the class teacher to see this message before the SMS absence alert is sent out at 10am. If you need to update your mobile phone number please see the office staff.

## CRICKET NEWS

On Friday, the 27<sup>th</sup> of October, The Junction Public School played Charlestown South Public School in the 5<sup>th</sup> round of the PSSA State Cricket Knockout. We lost the toss and were put into bowl first. The opening bowlers Jack and Jonah bowled consistently only being hit for 9 runs in the first 5 overs. After a great first 5 overs Charlie and Kate came onto bowl. In Charlie's first over he found the breakthrough that we needed. This put Charlestown in the position of 1 out for 24 runs. Two overs later the second wicket came with Kate bowling a wicket maiden. At the break Charlestown were 2 out for a total of 37.

After the break Charlestown started to get the runs on the board, scoring a quick 20 runs in 5 overs. In the next two overs The Junction took two great wickets putting a massive amount of pressure on them. However in the next four overs Charlestown hit another 20 runs putting them in a respectable position. At the end of the Innings Charlestown were 5 out for 92 runs. This game was still only half over and we needed to play well to defeat them.

In the second Innings our opening batsman Angus and Jack came into bat, however Angus was dismissed in the second over. This put an enormous amount of pressure on us to get the runs on the board. Fortunately, that was no trouble when Jonah came into bat. He hit a quick 4 on his third ball easing the pressure of our shoulders. We batted well for our first eight overs scoring 33 runs, but then Jonah hit a top edge and was caught out. Now we were 2

out for 33 runs. After the fall of Jonah's wicket Charlie came into bat. He scored efficiently, letting us make it to the break without losing another wicket. At the break we were 2 out for an outstanding 59 runs.

After the drinks break we came back out to bat knowing that there weren't many more runs to score. However, in the 18<sup>th</sup> over our opener Jack was dismissed for a top score of 30 runs. Jack getting out was a huge blow for the Junction, but that didn't seem to change our attitude. We ended up making the runs within the next four overs. The end result was 92 runs to 93 runs our way. It was a great win for The Junction and I'm sure Caves Beach will have to watch out for us!

Thank you to all the parents, scorers and the umpires who helped us on the day and a special thanks to the whole cricket team who played their heart out.
