Classes will not be formed for 2019 until we know numbers have settled.

END OF YEAR PRESENTATION DAYS

A reminder that our Presentation Days will take place on **Thursday 13th and Friday 14th December** this year. We will start on Thursday 13th December with a 'Whole school assembly' from Kinder to Year 6 at 9.00am in the COLA area. Major awards and prizes will be presented as well as invest and present the 2019 school captains, prefects, sports house captains and vice captains with their badges. This assembly should take approximately (1) hour.

At the following assemblies, in the new school hall, every single child in every class will be called forward to receive a certificate.

At 10.15am on Thursday 13th December in the new school hall we will start with the Stage 3 assembly (Years 5 and 6) – and present the class awards and some special Stage awards.

At 11.30am on Thursday 13th December we will continue with the Stage 2 assembly (Years 3 and 4) and present the class awards and some special Stage awards. This assembly should conclude by 1.00pm.

At 9.00am on Friday 14th December in the new school hall we will hold the Early Stage 1 assembly – (Kindergarten) and present the class awards and some special Stage awards. At 9.45am (approx) on Friday 14th December we will continue with the Stage 1 assembly (Years 1 and 2) and present the class awards and some special Stage awards. This assembly should conclude by 11.15am (approx.)

Presentation Day will be focused on celebrating the achievements of all students and recognising their efforts over the whole year.

Collaborative Planning for 2019

On Thursday 6 December and Wednesday 12 of December you may notice more casual teachers within the school than is usual. This is because some of our teachers will be involved in collaborative planning for 2019. Collaborative planning involves updating our whole school scope and sequence of learning and the associated units of work to reflect new syllabuses, and to create new units of work for 2019. This will include embedding the digital technologies as well as the general capabilities such as literacy and numeracy. This planning will be shared with all staff first day back in 2019. The classes whose teachers will be involved in planning on both days are: KK, KS, 1S, 1/2B, 2C, 3LJ,3S, 5B,6C and 6B. Friday 7 December will see our Assistant Principals work with Mrs Emmington and Mrs Larkman on the Annual Report and whole school planning so there will be casual teachers on KK, 1S, 2C, 3LJ and 5B.

We are quite fortunate at The Junction PS that we can call on a large group of quality casual teachers to continue the teaching and learning programs that our class teachers have programmed for the day. Our casual teachers tell us that our students are welcoming, helpful and well behaved. Well done TJPS students.

ACER Certificates

This week marks the last week of the ACER (Australian College of Educational Research) online certificates. Over the last semester, select students in Years 2-6 provided feedback to ACER for the online learning modules as they worked through them and completed certificates Level 1 and 2 in Reading and Numeracy. The results of these certificates will be made available to the school and to parents. Year 6 results will be shared with respective high schools.

These students were identified early in the year by their teachers as students who are high achievers in both literacy and numeracy. The results from the ACER certificates will provide teachers with detailed data on the levels of literacy and numeracy proficiency attained by these students. This will assist teachers in 2019 to provide targeted programs which focus on the students' proximal zone of development. Note: NAPLAN does not provide data for differentiation at the top of the bands.

Within our School Plan, 2018 has been marked as the year to establish baseline data for our Gifted and Talented and High Performing students. Teachers support the needs of these students by pinpointing where they are up to in their learning and planning where to next. By establishing a baseline we aim to measure the real growth of these students over time to ensure that they thrive academically and flourish emotionally and socially. The use of accurate data and the focus on growth enables teachers to select the programs, strategies and resources that impact learning best.

At The Junction Public School every child is known, cared for and championed by a dedicated team of

quality teachers who make use of data to drive teaching and learning.

SWIMMING CARNIVAL 2019

All students in Year 2-5 (2018) received a 'Blue' Swimming Carnival note for our 2019 Swimming Carnival which is on Thursday 31st January (Week 1) next year! Students who are currently in Year 1 and will be turning 8 years old in 2019 will also receive a note. These students should only attend and compete at the Carnival if they can swim 50m with confidence. Students in Year 2 (2019) who cannot swim 50m or are not turning 8 years old in 2019 will stay here at school with their teacher.

As the Carnival is the second day back at school for 2019 we ask that parents be prompt with the Permission note and payment.

YEAR 6 CANBERRA EXCURSION

DAY 1

Year 6 arrived at school at 6am, on Monday 19th November, 2018. Upon arrival Neil and Doug were waiting with our coaches. The bus journey to Canberra was long but we got to see lots of different places along the way including Lake George. We finally arrived in the Australian Capital Territory (ACT) by 1pm; we counted down until we reached the border. We drove to the edge of Lake Burley-Griffin and had lunch. We watched the Captain Cook fountain shoot water 140m into the air. After lunch, we went to the National Capital Exhibition and discovered the planning and design behind our Nation's capital. Next, we visited the National Art Gallery. Year 6 were divided into small groups and were given a tour around the Gallery where we observed priceless art works, models of graves for the Indigenous Australians and a walk-through sculpture. Finally, drove to our accommodation at Camp Cottermouth. Later that evening we headed off to Questacon which was a real highlight of the trip.

DAY 2

After an early start and a delicious hot breakfast comprising of bacon and eggs, Year 6 headed in two different directions. Bus 1 headed to Old Parliament House and participated in a mock voting role play whereas Bus 2 headed to the CSIRO Discovery Centre and played a scavenger hunt game using QR codes and i-pads. Both buses then swapped activities. Next we drove to Mount Ainslie which looked over the whole of Canberra. After lunch we went on a self-guided tour of the War Memorial. We saw a Centurion 5B next to two armoured cars, the main battery gun and the control tower of the HMAS Brisbane. Inside we saw guns of soldiers who died and their uniforms. A highlight of the War Memorial was discovering relatives who had participated in World War 2. For example, Vincent found a plane whose model name was Messerschmitt BF 109 and could have been flown by his great grandfather in World War 2. After the War Memorial, we drove back to camp, had dinner and then headed off to the Australian Institute of Sport (AIS). We had a tour of the facilities and watched the National volleyball team train. After our tour, we went to Sportex and played virtual sports games such as cycling, skiing and soccer penalty shooting.

DAY 3

On Wednesday, we travelled up to the Telstra Tower. It was really high but it didn't take long to get to the top as the elevator was super-fast. Next we visited Parliament House and had the opportunity to tour the House of Representatives and the Senate. We also participated in a role-play where we passed a bill in the House of Representatives. We discovered that the longest time someone has spoken there were 12 ½ hours, a time limit has now been enforced due to this. Our bus drivers took us on a tour of Embassy drive where various countries are represented there. We then headed back to camp for dinner and then had a 'trivia night'. There were lots of laughs, onesies and chocolate to be had that night.



DAY 4

Our last day! By this stage of the trip, most of us were extremely tired but still having a great time. We only one last place to visit until we headed home, The National Museum. We saw lots of cool things there including Phar Lap's heart. After lunch, we began our journey back to Newcastle arriving here around 6pm. Year 6 had a fabulous time and really appreciated the opportunity we had to see our Nation's capital and deepen our understanding of what we learnt in class. Thank you to our parents and teachers for this wonderful opportunity.

Office Hours - 8.30AM TO 3.15PM

Late Arrivals / Early Leavers

School hours are from 9am to 3pm. If children arrive later than 9am, parents are requested to accompany them to the office to provide late arrivals information to office staff. A 'Purple Partial Slip' is then taken to the class teacher. Similarly, if children leave early for the day, parents are required to go to the office first and a 'Purple Partial slip' is then given to the class teacher when children are collected from the classroom.

These procedures are in line with the Department's Attendance policy.

Money collection for excursions & events

All money will come straight to the office, this includes:-Dance fees, Band fees, School resources, Excursion money etc.

The school accepts cash (exact amount is appreciated - we do not have a float as money is banked every day), cheque or we have Eftpos facilities in the office. Please note that the school Eftpos facility is only available for school payments and not P & C - such as the Uniform Shop.

Payments can also be made through the "Make a Payment" tab on the **school website**.

If you use this online option, please make sure you still return your permission note to school.

Please be aware that the Parent Online Payments may take 24-48 hours to show up on our Banking site.

The school welcomes part payments towards any costs for fees, excursions or incursions. Thank you

Absences

The Skoolbag App is the best way to advise the school of student absences, or alternatively phone the school, send an email or write a note. Each day at around 10am, the school sends out a SMS alert to parents of anyone who has an unexplained absence for that day.

If you are going away and the leave is over (5) school days, you must complete an "Extended Leave Form" from the office prior to your leave.

PLEASE REFRAIN FROM USING A CLASS DOJO MESSAGE TO ADVISE OF SICK LEAVE ETC.

The teacher might not see this message before the Office send the SMS alert around 10am to parents.

Medication at School

The office is only able to administer 'prescribed medication' to students. This means medication that has been prescribed by a doctor. This medication must be left in the package provided, clearly labelled with the child's name and dosage. If medication is required, a parent will need to come to the office and complete a Medical Deed of Indemnity form. Following DoE's Health Care Policy - We are not able to administer Panadol or non-prescription medications.

UNIFORM SHOP

The Uniform shop is open on Mondays from 8.45am to about 9.15am in the demountable behind the New School Hall.

Payment for Uniform Orders here at the school shop on a Monday is by Cash, Cheque or EFTPOS. Please be aware when you are purchasing hats at the office, you are only able to pay by cash or cheque. The P & C Eftpos cannot be used by the office.
