REPORTS

The Semester 1 reports will go home next week. It is a summary of what your child has achieved over the last 6 months.

In the lead up to reporting, teachers and students have spent time assessing learning and reflecting on where to next for Semester 2. This is the time of year where students consider their goals and look to setting new ones for the remainder of the year.

Our teachers spend considerable time working together to achieve consistency across stages and years when it comes to judging student work and awarding grades. It is important to note that if a child achieves a 'Sound' this means that they have met **all** the year group requirements for the Stage outcomes covered in that period. Achieving a grade of High or Outstanding indicates that they are working either a year above (high) or two years above (outstanding) at that point in time.

Teachers collaboratively assess student work and make professional judgements based on the work your child produces. This determines the allocation of the grade as measured against the syllabus outcomes. It is important to note that all children learn at different rates, therefore at different points in time their achievements and grades may vary.

Formal appointments to discuss your child's learning needs are important. If you would like an interview to discuss your child's learning, please contact the school early in **Term 3** to make an appointment with your child's teacher(s).

UNIFORM

As we enter a phase of change in our current uniform, students have the option to wear their sports uniform on the days when they participate in sport or physical activities, such as JAK. Year 6 Uniforms

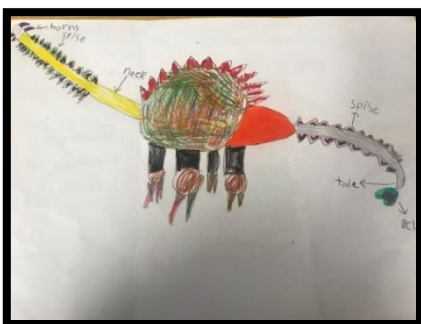

Money collection for excursions & events

All money will come straight to the office, this includes:- Dance fees, Band fees, School books, Excursion money etc.

There is a "Payments" slot at the front counter in the school office – please post payments in this slot.

For this to work successfully, we ask that any money that is sent into school be in a sealed envelope with your "Child's name and class" on the front and details of what event you are paying for. Plastic lunch bags that seal are ideal. The school accepts cash (**exact amount is appreciated - we do not have a float-money is banked every day**), cheque or we have Eftpos facilities in the office. Please note that the school Eftpos facility is only available for school payments and **not P & C – such as the Uniform Shop**. Payments can also be made through the "Make a Payment" tab on the **school website**.

If you use this online option, please make sure you still return your permission note to school.

Absences

Any absence from school must be explained. The Skoolbag App is a great way to advise the school of student absences, or alternatively phone the school, send an email or write a note. Each day at around 10am, the school sends out an SMS alert to parents of anyone who has an unexplained absence for that day. Please refrain from using the Class Dojo to explain absences as the teacher may not be at school or they are on class and unable to read the Dojo message before 10am.

If you are going away and the leave is over (5) school days, you must complete an "Extended Leave Form" from the office prior to your leave.

Late Arrivals / Early Leavers

School hours are from 9am to 3pm. First assembly is at 8.55am. If children arrive later than 9am, parents are requested to accompany them to the office to provide late arrivals information to office staff. A 'Purple Partial Slip' is then taken to the class teacher. Similarly, if children leave early for the day, parents are required to go to the office first and a 'Purple Partial slip' is then given to the class teacher when children are collected from the classroom. The 'Purple Partial Slip' indicates to the teacher you have been to the office to have the partial leave processed on the computer.

Medication at School

The office is only able to administer 'prescribed medication' to students. This means medication that has been prescribed by a doctor. This medication must be left in the package provided, clearly labelled with the child's name and dosage. If medication is required, a parent will need to come to the office and complete a Medical Deed of Indemnity form. We are not able to administer any medication without this indemnity form being completed. **We are not able to administer Panadol or non-prescription medications.**

UNIFORM SHOP

The Uniform shop is open on Mondays from 8.45am to about 9.15am in the new space between the Senior Girls' and Boys' facilities just along from Class 4L.

Payment for Uniform Orders here at the school shop on a Monday is by Cash, Cheque or EFTPOS. Please be aware when you are purchasing hats at the office, you are only able to pay by cash or cheque. The P & C Eftpos cannot be used by the office.

INTERRELATE Family Evening Program

Parent interest has requested the P&C help co-ordinate the return of this optional community program.

Interrelate has the acknowledgement of Government, Education and Health authorities to provide relationship

education with schools. They offer evening educational primary programs to help parents hold discussions with children about sexuality, gender identity, reproductive systems - Where did I come from talk? and Preparing for puberty. These programs are aimed at children 8-10yrs and 10-13 years. These sessions will be held on Monday 19th August (Week 5) – more information next term.

NEW SCHOOL UNIFORM UPDATE:

Following a survey sent to the school community in late 2018, large support was seen for a 5-day / week unisex school uniform (84% voted 'yes' out of 93 responses). In addition, a survey by Year 6 student leaders in early 2019 identified substantial support from TJPS students.

Three potential designs have been identified for the new school uniform shirt and a new design for the shorts. Two separate clothing manufacturers have been identified as potential suppliers, with differing shirt fabrics and price point.

Final shirt and shorts samples have just arrived. We are in the process of creating a family survey. We anticipate the school community will have the opportunity to start voting before the end of term and into early next term.

This survey provides images of the three different shirt designs from the two manufacturers and an opportunity to vote on your preferred option. Samples of the shirts will also be available for a closer inspection in the admin office of TJPS and voting may be completed there instead of online. At the same time, the TJPS leadership group will survey all students at TJPS and show the samples.

Given substantial production lead times for large school uniform orders, we are hoping to have the new uniform available for 2020 kindy families in Term 4, 2019 and the remainder of the school by early 2020.

Please note, **the current uniform will continue to remain as options for students to wear on non-sport days in 2020**. That is the girl's summer/winter tunic/black track pants/white shirt and boys' summer white shirt/grey shorts and winter grey pants/white shirt.
