# STAGE 1 EXCURSION – SHARK AND RAY CENTRE AND DOLPHIN WATCH CRUISE

To complement our English and Science programs from earlier in the year, an excursion has been organised for Stage 1 students to visit the Irukandji Shark and Ray Centre, Anna Bay and enjoy a dolphin watch cruise at Nelson Bay. At the Shark and Ray Centre students will have the opportunity to learn about and interact directly with small sharks and rays in the shallow pool area. Students will also enjoy a cruise around Port Stephens in search of the local bottlenose dolphins who reside in the Bay.

Classes 1B, 1J, 1S and 1G will visit on Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> November, 2020 and classes 1/2L, 2C, 2Mc and Year 2 students from 2/3A will visit on Friday 4<sup>th</sup> December, 2020. Permission notes have been sent home this week.

#### **SWIMMING PROGRAM**

Due to COVID-19 restrictions the decision was made to cancel the Stage 1 swimming program scheduled for the first two weeks of Term 4 this year. In light of a current easing of restrictions we have been able to book in for a '5 day' program for our current Year 2 students (Year 3 - 2021) at the beginning of next year. Arnold's Swim centre have provided us with a Covid Safe Plan which ensures our students will not be sharing facilities with the community at any time during the program and that intensive cleaning of the change rooms will take place before and after each group. The swimming program will operate from Monday 1st February to Friday 5th February, 2021. This is the perfect opportunity for students to have some intensive instruction just prior to our School Swimming Carnival in Week 4.

Year 1 and 2 students (2021) remain scheduled to attend their regular 9 day program in the first two weeks of Term 4, 2021.

A special thanks to Jody Cooper and Rachel West, who gave up their mornings and lunchtimes to help with the Book Fair.


#### **BOOK PARADE**

# SEEKING ETHICS TEACHERS AT TJPS FOR 2021

#### Could you be an ethics teacher at TJPS?

We are losing a couple of ethics teachers for next year and are in need of some new, enthusiastic volunteers in order to continue to provide ethics classes for all the families who have requested it for their children.

Ethics teachers receive full training by Primary Ethics, the not-for-profit organisation approved to design curriculum and training for the ethics program. Training consists of a two-day workshop and short online modules. All lesson materials are provided.

Suitable volunteers have an interest in children's education and development of critical thinking skills and must be available at Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday afternoons for up to an hour each week.

In ethics classes, children learn how to think logically, disagree respectfully and support their arguments with evidence, rather than act according to blind habit or peer pressure.

Children discuss topic such as:

- imagining how others feel
- how do we treat living things?
- what is laziness?
- how do we disagree in a respectful way?
- fairness
