# LEADERSHIP REPORT

Hello to our community,

Welcome back to a new Term. We are very lucky that our students were able to return to school after these winter holidays and we are all very mindful of the fact that many students in Sydney and Greater Sydney, at this moment, are learning online at home. Our teachers are ready and prepared to move to online learning if it becomes necessary upon the advice of NSW Health. We have started this term with some restrictions back in place due to COVID. All updates will be passed on to families via our schoolbag app. At this point in time parents are no longer able to come on site and hence drop of and pickups will be at the school gate. Please support the safety of our community by adhering to these requirements set by NSW Health.

#### Please understand this includes no access beyond the gates including no entry into the front admin office. (Please see the Skoolbag notification of last Friday send out at 10.18am)

Due to current COVID restrictions, many of our Excursions planned for Term 3 have had to be cancelled. This is very disappointing for students and teachers alike. Teachers are working very hard to provide alternative experiences back at school. At this stage these excursions have been cancelled: Year 4 Sydney Hyde Park Barracks and Stage 1 Sydney Museum. Alternative dates are being looked at for the Year 6 Canberra Excursion.

# NAIDOC

In the final week of Term 2 our teachers provided some wonderful experiences for our students following on from the garden planting on the Monday to the announcement of the winner of our Garden Naming Competition from 9 finalists at our NAIDOC Assembly on Thursday. Our didge group performance at assembly was a credit to Mr Begnell and the Aboriginal Education Team coordinated a range of learning activities for each stage around the themes of native plants, stories, fire, art, and Indigenous games. Mr Radnidge coordinated the NAIDOC BBQ which was a treat for all students with crocodile and kangaroo on the menu.

Our NAIDOC Tree was finished with every student creating a leaf now pinned to the tree. Once restrictions

lift, we hope parents will come in and admire this installation of student work and learning. The tree represents, connects, and celebrates the diversity of our student body with each leaf designed by students incorporating the learning behind the 2021 NAIDOC Theme 'Heal Country'. #### Education Week 2021 - 26-30 July

Education Week is celebrated every year and marks the achievements of our school, our students and the learning community. This year's theme is Lifelong Learners and although COVID has put a hold on many of the activities where the learning community can come together and celebrate, students and teachers will still be marking the week with activities and sharing learning with families via Seesaw and Dojo.

#### Murrook

For our staff development day at the start of Term 3 our staff spent the day at the Murrook Culture Centre. This was a day spent learning about Aboriginal culture, appreciating its beauty, its long history and acknowledging its diversity. Murrook's philosophy is 'in helping others understand such cultural competencies by spending time with Aboriginal people because these are not things you can learning from books, lectures or the internet - only through spending time on country with Aboriginal elders as guides'. The learning from this day spent on country has equipped our staff with greater confidence to teach Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander perspectives.



### Library

Our Library has undergone huge changes over the last few terms. Many older novels and outdated texts have been culled and new books and collections are being



acquired with students encouraged to suggest the novels and authors that they would like to see. Ms Willoughby, Ms Renna and Mrs Emmington have looked very carefully at the range of voices and perspectives held within our library choosing both fiction and non-fiction titles written by many more authors from diverse cultural backgrounds. Many new titles both fiction and non-fiction written by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander authors have been added to our library collection with some wonderful titles and stories being shared by students and added to our teaching and learning programs by teachers. Many of these authors feature on the CBCA shortlist this year. Head to cbca.org.au to see the shortlist. Ms. Renna kindly shared the list and the resources for teaching and learning activities with teachers last week.



Attention will be turning to the hundreds of older home readers in classrooms in the latter half of this year as there are many outdated titles and old and worn out books. We will be replenishing home readers with new titles very soon.

# Office Hours - 8.30AM TO 3.15PM

## Money collection for excursions & events

All money will come straight to the office with students, this includes:- Band fees, School books, Excursion money etc. There is a "Payments" slot at the front counter in the school office – students can post payments in this slot.

For this to work successfully, we ask that any money that is sent into school be in a sealed envelope with your "**Child's name and class**" on the front and details of what event you are paying. The school accepts cash (exact amount is appreciated - we do not have a float-money is banked every day), cheque or we have Eftpos facilities in the office. (Temporarily unavailable to parents in the office area) Please note that the school Eftpos facility is only available for school payments and not P & C – such as the Uniform Shop. Payments can also be made through the "Make a Payment" tab on the school website.

If you use this online option, please make sure you still return your permission note to school.

Payments at this present time are preferrable on the Online Parent Portal (POP)

# The school office can no longer accept EFTPOS payments over the phone.

## Absences

Any absence from school must be explained. The Skoolbag App is a great way to advise the school of student absences, or alternatively phone the school, send an email or write a

note. Each day at around 10am, the school sends out a SMS alert to parents of anyone who has an unexplained absence for that day. Please refrain from using the Class Dojo to explain absences as the teacher may not be at school or they are on class and unable to read the Dojo message before 10am.

If you are going away and the leave is over (5) school days, you must complete an "EXTENDED LEAVE FORM" from the office prior to your leave.

#### Late Arrivals / Early Leavers

School hours are from 9am to 3pm. First assembly is at 8.55am. If children arrive later than 9am, parents are requested to call the office to provide late arrivals information to office staff. A 'Purple Partial Slip' is then taken by the child to the class teacher. Similarly, if children leave early for the day, parents must phone the office and admin staff will call for your child to come up to the office area to be marked out of the school and then escorted to the front gate. Please be aware of early departures in recess break (11am to 11.20am) and the lunch break (1pm to 1.50pm) as it can be quite difficult to locate your child in the playground.

#### **Medication at School**

The office is only able to administer 'prescribed medication' to students. This means medication that has been prescribed by a doctor. This medication must be left in the package provided, clearly labelled with the child's name and dosage. If medication is required, a parent will need to email the office and complete a Medical Deed of Indemnity form. WE ARE NOT ABLE TO ADMINISTER PANADOL OR NON-PRESCRIPTION MEDICATIONS.
