
Attendance Matters

School expectations are that students attend school 95% of the time. Any less and they are missing out on important learning alongside their peers. Please have a look at some important attendance and learning statistics shared by the NSW Department of Education.



Learning Good Habits - Arriving to school on time

Arriving to school every day on time is very important. Missing 5 minutes every day equates to three days lost per year of learning. Half an hour late every day means that your child has lost 18 days of learning at school for that year. Developing good habits through good home routines from a young age is key to avoiding habitual lateness. Sometimes families do run late and to support you there are school procedures in place for late arrivals and early leavers. Parents may now accompany their child to the office to help with signing them in and out. 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Information from the Front Office Team...

LOST PROPERTY It is disheartening to see the number of jackets, hats, lunch boxes and drink bottles with no names on them that we are receiving everyday in the lost property boxes. Without names, these items cannot be returned to students. The school holidays would be a good time to ensure that all items have student's names that are clearly written, thank you. We also have had a lost Souths JRFC jacket handed in.

<u>Band and Strings Ensemble Fees are now due for Term 3 and</u> **overdue** for Terms 1 and 2

Money collection for excursions & events

<u>The preferred payment option is through the "Make a Payment" tab on the school website.</u>

A new feature on our excursion notes is a QR Code to take you directly to the Make a Payment tab

All cash payments to come straight to the office, this includes: - Band fees, School books, Excursion money etc. There is a "Payments" slot at the front counter in the school office – students are to post payments in this slot. Any money that is sent to school must be in a sealed envelope with your "Child's name and class" on the front and details of the event you are paying. The school accepts cash, (exact amount only), cheque or we have EFTPOS facilities in the office. Please note that the school EFTPOS facility is only available for school payments and not P&C items – such as the Uniform Shop.

<u>If you use the online option, please make sure you still return permission</u> notes to school.

Absences

Any absence from school must be explained. The Skoolbag App is a great way to advise the school of student absences, or alternatively phone the school, send an email or write a note. Each day at around 10am, the school sends out an SMS alert to parents of any child who has an unexplained absence for that day. Please refrain from using class apps like Class Dojo to explain absences as the teacher may not be at school or they are teaching and unable to read the Dojo message before 10am.

Extended Leave

If you are going away and leave is over (5) school days, you must complete an "EXTENDED LEAVE FORM" (available from the office) prior to your leave.

Late Arrivals / Early Leavers

School hours are from 8.55am to 3pm. The first assembly starts at 8.55am. If children arrive later than 8.55am, they need to present with a parent to the office to provide late arrival information to office staff. A 'Purple Partial Slip' is then taken to the class teacher. Similarly, if children need to leave early for the day, parents must buzz the intercom at Union Street for the gate to be opened. Admin staff will call the classroom for your child to come up to the office area to be collected. Please try to avoid early departures during recess (11.00 -11.20am) and lunch breaks (1.00 -1.50pm) as it can be quite difficult to locate your child in the playground.

Medication at School

The office is only able to administer 'prescribed medication' to students. This means medication that has been prescribed by a doctor. This medication must be left in the package provided, clearly labelled with the child's name and dosage. If medication is required, a parent will need to come to the office and complete a Prescribed Medication Indemnity form.

Winanga-y Dreaming Dance Program







Our students began their Aboriginal Dance program last week.

Students will learn about the importance of Aboriginal Dance and how Aboriginal dance is a form of communication, storytelling and an integral part of different ceremonies.

In our first session, students learnt

- the difference in traditional Aboriginal dancing and Aboriginal contemporary dancing
- about the meaning around ochre and costumes when dancing
- the story behind the greeting dance and the movements to the dance
- some Aboriginal language that is involved in the dancing

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NAIDOC Celebrations

NAIDOC Week was a lot of fun! We had an assembly where Aunty Donna Meehan came and spoke about her life story, the Didge group performed, and we heard from our Aboriginal students.

Everyone who had a part spoke wonderfully!

After the assembly, the different stages took it in turns to participate in 4 fun Aboriginal games – taught by some of our Year 6 students.

We played:

- · Kai, basically keeping the ball in the air
- · Apwerte, a bowling and golf hybrid
- · Jumpinpin, the original dodgeball
- · Gorri, where you throw tennis balls at a rolling yoga ball

Stage 3 were lucky enough to have some additional time with our special guest, the author of 'It is no secret', Aunty Donna Meehan. All of Stage 3 have been reading her novel in our classes and we were truly grateful to have the time to listen to her story with respect and ask her some burning questions we had after reading her engaging book.

At lunch time we had a BBQ, we got to eat yummy sausages, meanwhile the Aboriginal students all had kangaroo sausages because of all the hard work at the assembly. Sadly, we did not have crocodile meat because the order didn't arrive on time!

In addition to our day of activities, Mrs Lalic has organised a huge collaborative art project that the whole school is involved in. Every student in the school is carving an Aboriginal Art symbol or a native animal that they connect with into a clay tile. Once completed these tiles will be put together to create a large eagle-hawk (for the Awabakal totem) and a stingray (which represents the waterways). Each Aboriginal student will create a handprint and the Year 6 students will also design a feather shaped tile for the outer edges of the eagle-hawk. This incredible artwork will be displayed in the school.

In conclusion, this year's NAIDOC was a lot of fun, hopefully next year it'll be even better.
